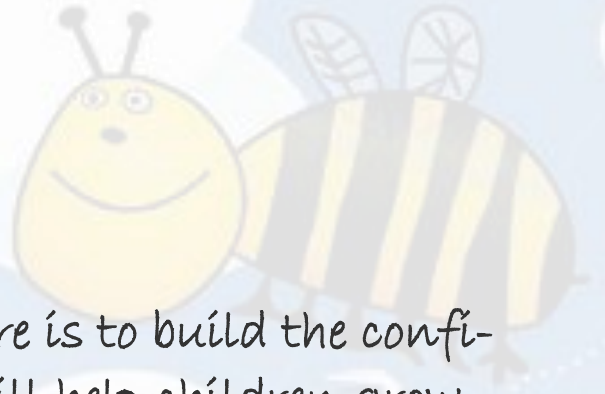

## Ingol CPS Curriculum

At Ingol Community Primary School we offer a curriculum which is broad and balanced and which builds on the knowledge, understanding and skills of all children, whatever their starting point, as they progress through each Key Stage. The curriculum incorporates the statutory requirements of the National Curriculum 2014 and other experiences and opportunities which best meet the learning and developmental needs of the pupils in our school. The aim of our curriculum is for pupils to have the requisite skills to be successful, independent and motivated learners in readiness for their next stage of education. It is important that the curriculum considers the development of the whole child **regardless of their starting point.**

At Ingol CPS we have created our own curriculum bespoke to the needs of our children and designed in a way that children learn and remember more through a spiral system. They reflect the principles underpinning effective learning that is relevant and purposeful for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.

Written by subject specialists, these resources:

- Identify the **key learning** within each national curriculum subject area to ensure effective progression across the primary phase;
- Provide a **yearly progression** in which key learning is mapped within and across themes from Reception to Y6;
- Include **detailed themed units** comprising main subjects, additional subjects and ongoing subjects for each half term across the year.

### **Key Learning**

We also ensure we provide enrichment opportunities through school visits and visitors.



## Our Uniform

Our school uniform consists of the following:

Green school sweatshirt or Green cardigan

Grey or black trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore

White polo shirt

Green check summer dress

Black shoes (Trainers are not allowed except for outdoor PE)

School sweatshirts and polo shirts embossed with the school name are available from the school uniform shop Bang Bang in Preston City Centre

### PE Kit

White t-shirt and black or green shorts with pumps can be worn. PE Kit with logo is available from Bang Bang. This includes a white top with green sleeves and a green hooded sweatshirt, both with our school logo on. Trainers and black tracksuit bottoms can be worn for outdoor PE. Black leggings or joggers can be worn in winter months.

### Jewellery

Wrist watches and earrings which are small studs are the only items of jewellery permitted to be worn in school. Studs and watches must be removed by your child for PE or sport activities. If earrings can't be removed, they must be covered with plasters or tape for PE days.

**No make up, false tan or nail varnish allowed.**

## Our School Day

Parents may book into Breakfast Club from 7.30am via ParentPay. Two options are available, from 7.30am and from 8 am. Please book these in advance as they are busy.

There are tables set out in the hall where children are supervised until 8.45am when they are escorted out on to the playground. The Junior playground is supervised from 8.45am.

Our School day begins at 8.55am. Any child arriving late should come in to school through the main entrance where they will be asked to sign in using our InVentry System We do ask for your support to see that your child arrives in good time every day.

We take part in the National Fruit Scheme, so our Infant children are given a piece of fruit or vegetable to eat every day.

Pupils have access to drinking water throughout the day. All children have their own water bottle in school that they are allowed to use during the course of the day.

At lunch time, children can either have a school meal or bring a packed lunch. We are very fortunate in having all our school meals prepared for us in our own kitchen. The food is excellent – very healthy and nutritious – and enjoyed by many children and adults!

Afternoon break is from 2.00 – 2.15pm for the Infants.

The school day ends at 3.15pm for KS2 and 3.10 for KS1. Parents are very welcome to come on to the playgrounds to meet their children at this time.

After school club runs from 3.15 until 5.45. Please book via the ParentPay app

## Admissions Policy

The admission policy of a community school is the responsibility of the local education authority. Parents should contact the school between September and March the year before their child's 5th birthday. There is a fixed limit to the number of children admitted each year. Parents will be informed soon after 31st of March if a place is available for their child. We are usually able to accept all children whose parents choose Ingol School.

When this is not possible, priority is given to:-

1. A brother or sister of a child already attending the school
2. A child for whom the Authority accepts that there is a strong medical, social or welfare reason for admission.

The remaining places are allocated with references to the distance:- (i) between home and the school of the parents' preference AND (ii) between home and the nearest school at which a place is available.

Admission proformas are available online through LCC pupil admissions website. We also hold paper copies in our office.

We have a carefully planned induction programme for Reception children which includes meetings for parents, pre-school visits, pupil profile meetings and invitations to school events. Parents of children who are not yet of school age are very welcome to visit the school. Similarly, parents who wish to transfer their child(ren) from another school to Ingol Community Primary School are welcome to contact us in order to make arrangements to visit .

Children move on to High School at the end of the summer term of the school year in which their eleventh birthday falls. The Local Education Authority makes arrangements for a place for your child. We have excellent relationships with many of the local High Schools and liaise with them regarding taster days and information evenings.

Mid year admission are processed by LCC Pupil Access and prospective parents must contact them to be allocated a place mid year.

## Parents As Partners

### Reporting to Parents

We hold a parents afternoon every November to discuss pupils progress and to give parents the opportunity to look through their child's books.

The school sends a progress report home to parents at the end of every Spring term and a more detailed report at the end of each school year. This is a summary of your child's achievements in all curriculum subjects and wider school activities. You will be given the opportunity to discuss the report with your child's teacher.

### Parent –Teacher Contact

The partnership that we have with our parents is very important to us. We want to share your child's education with you because this can make a big difference to their school life and the progress that they make. There are two official Parents' evening each year. The door is always open and you can come in at any time to talk about school and your child. If you have any concerns we will always try to help and will take time to find a quiet place for you to talk to us. We use Class Dojo as our home/school communication app.

### Home/School Agreements

Every pupil and parent will be asked to sign a Home/School Agreement. This forms the basis of the mutual respect we have in relation to your child's learning and behaviour.

### PTFA

We have a very proactive PTFA who are always looking for new members to assist them in organising fund raising events.
